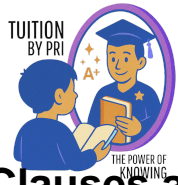
Clauses and Sentences - Fluency

Clauses and Sentences - Reasoning

3. Why is this incorrect? When we left. We went home.
4. Which conjunction is best: and, but, or although?
5. How does this sentence structure affect its meaning?
6. Spot the subordinate clause: We sang because we were happy.
7. Which sentence has two main clauses joined with 'and'?
8. Why is this not a sentence? In the shop.
9. What makes this sentence more formal?
10. Explain the structure of this compound sentence.



Clauses and Sentences - Problem Solving

1. Rewrite to make a complex sentence: He was late. He missed the bus.
2. Combine ideas using a conjunction: The sun was out. We went walking.
3. Improve this sentence: It rained.
4. Add a subordinate clause: She smiled.
5. Reorder this: Because it was cold, they stayed in.
6. Split this compound sentence into two: I was tired but I stayed up.
7. Fix this run-on sentence: He was cold he wore a coat.
8. Write your own sentence using a main and subordinate clause.
9. Rewrite this question as a statement: Is he coming?
10. Improve this to be more descriptive and structured.
